Dear Congresswoman Boebert,

I am committed to ensuring that each member of the Republican Conference has information on how their priorities are addressed in the appropriations bills, and this letter includes important information on the final appropriations package for Fiscal Year 2022.

The House Republican Conference was united in our opposition to the partisan Fiscal Year 2022 appropriations bills that Speaker Pelosi brought to the House floor last summer. We made it clear we would not support the controversial policies and irresponsible spending levels championed by the House Democrats. As a conference, our unity positioned us for major GOP wins during final conference negotiations. We successfully pushed back on the Democrats' demands and produced a bill that includes many Republican priorities.

The final appropriations package increases defense spending across all bills by roughly \$42 billion above last year and cuts wasteful domestic spending by nearly 9% below the Biden Administration's budget request. All legacy riders are retained in the bill, including pro-life protections such as the Hyde Amendment, which the Democrats were determined to drop. The bill strengthens our national security, modernizes our nuclear weapons stockpile, and addresses the ongoing crisis at the border. It also demonstrates our strong commitment to life.

Attached to this letter you will find two documents. The first one details our conservative policy wins in the final appropriations package. The second includes a list of your individual priorities that were included in each appropriations bill.

**Congresswoman Lauren Boebert (CO-03)**

**Commerce, Justice, Science, and Related Agencies**

1. \$2.6 billion for the National Aeronautics and Space Administration (NASA) Space Launch System (SLS), \$1.4 billion for the Orion Multi-Purpose Crew Vehicle, and \$590 million for Exploration Ground Systems.

**Interior, Environment, and Related Agencies**

1. Prohibits an Endangered Species Act Listing of greater sage-grouse.
2. Full funding for Payments in Lieu of Taxes (PILT) for fiscal year 2022.
3. \$1.8 million increase for U.S. Forest Service Forest Health Management with report language encouraging the Service to address high priority invasive species, pests, and diseases, including bark beetle infestations.
4. \$10 million in Bureau of Indian Affairs for the Indian Irrigation Fund.
5. No language is included regarding recovered gray wolves.
6. \$1 million in the Fish and Wildlife Service for the wolf-livestock loss demonstration program.

**Labor, Health and Human Services, Education, and Related Agencies**

1. Bill includes the Hyde and Weldon amendments.
2. \$1.74 billion for Community Health Centers in the Health Resources and Services Administration.

**Transportation, Housing and Urban Development, and Related Agencies**

1. Bill language exempts livestock haulers from Department of Transportation electronic logging device requirements.
